**104 “Great Schools” in Washington State Recognized as Highest Improving
in Reading and Math**

One-hundred and four Washington State schools will be honored for being amongst the 5% highest improving Washington schools in Reading and Mathematics over the last 5 school years.

“Recognition of the dedication and perseverance it takes to sustain improvement over multiple years is an essential component of supporting our educational system”, said Sue Mills, Executive Director at the Center for Educational Effectiveness (CEE), a Redmond-based educational research and data-service organization.

The 104 “Great Schools 2009” will be recognized for their sustained improvement at a Schools of Distinction luncheon on Sept. 26, at the *Great Schools and Exemplary Leaders Institute* sponsored by Phi Delta Kappa International (PDK)-Washington State and is being held at the Renton campus of City University.

In 2007 and 2008, this recognition was known as the "State Superintendent's Schools of Distinction-Learning Improvement Award." For 2009, sponsorship for this school-level, learning improvement award, now known as the "Great Schools Award" is through the Center for Educational Effectiveness (CEE) and the Washington Chapter of Phi Delta Kappa International (PDK-WA). The same methodology used to determine the Schools of Distinction award in 2007 and 2008 is being used to determine the “Great Schools” award for 2009.

“The award winners represent the diversity of Washington State” said Greg Lobdell, Director of Research for CEE. “All nine educational regions of the state are represented—from Aberdeen to Yakima and Almira to Wilbur—with everything in between. The diversity continues with district size; Seattle and Tacoma as large districts, Yakima and Pasco as medium districts, and Sultan and Sedro-Woolley as smaller districts. Students in these schools range between 2.7% and 100% poverty and 0% to 48.6% English language learners”.
