

WASHINGTON APPLE EDUCATION FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

AgNW Consulting. Applicants must be Washington state high school seniors or current college students from Washington state. Parents/Guardians of the applicants must be employed in an entry level or lower level management position by a commercial grower or packer in Washington's tree fruit industries. One \$1000 scholarship.

Betty Campbell Loudon Memorial. This scholarship is awarded in honor of Betty Lou Campbell Loudon, a 50 year resident of the Wenatchee Valley and graduate of WSU. It is open to graduating seniors from Wenatchee or Eastmont high schools or college students from Chelan or Douglas counties graduating from Wenatchee Valley College. Students must be pursuing a degree in Family and Consumer Sciences or Education at Washington State University. Scholarship amount varies.

Bill & Pat Dewitt Memorial. Open to graduating seniors and students currently enrolled at Wenatchee Valley College from Chelan, Douglas, Grant or Okanogan counties whose parents are involved in Washington's tree fruit industry. One \$500 scholarship.

Blue Bird, Inc. Open to graduating high school seniors whose parents/guardians, or applicants themselves, are growers or employees of Blue Bird, Inc., or an employee of a Blue Bird grower. Applicants must plan to attend an accredited two- or four- year community college, university or technical school. Two \$500 awards

Brian Kershaw Memorial. Established in memory of Brian Kershaw, the scholarship is open to graduating high school seniors and students currently enrolled in a two- or four-year college/university in Washington state. To qualify, applicant must be the child of parent(s) connected to Washington's tree fruit industry in the Yakima Valley. The scholarship may be renewed for up to four years, for students meeting the renewal qualifications. One \$1500 award will be made each year, either as a first or renewing scholarship.

Carl Herke Memorial. Open to graduating seniors of Highland High School pursuing a vocational education at an accredited technical school or community college. \$1000 scholarship.

CCM Scholarship Fund. Open to graduating seniors and students currently enrolled in a two- or four- year college/university whose parent(s) are employed at Columbia Marketing International, Columbia Fruit or McDougall & Sons, Inc. Parents' of interested applicants should pick up application and criteria from their personnel office. Scholarship amounts vary.

Conover Insurance. Applicants must be Washington state high school seniors or college students who are currently enrolled in an accredited Washington state college/university. Qualified candidates must be pursuing a career directly related to agri-business or agri-insurance. One \$500 scholarship.

Crane & Crane. Qualified applicants are graduating seniors whose parents are employed by Crane & Crane, Inc. or who are current year graduating seniors of Brewster, Bridgeport or Pateros high schools. Student must be pursuing an undergraduate education at a two- or four-year college/university or accredited technical school. Scholarship may be renewed for up to a total of four undergraduate years. Applicant must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 for consideration. One \$1000 scholarship.

Delmar Smith Memorial. Established by the Washington State Horticultural Association in memory of Delmar Smith, a leader in Washington State's tree fruit industry and in his local community. Applicants must be Tonasket High School seniors (Tonasket, WA). One \$500 scholarship.

Dick Clements Memorial. This scholarship is made in memory of Richard "Dick" Clements, a man known for his purpose, conviction and character and his devoted service to family, community, and tree fruit industry. The scholarship is open to graduating seniors from Central Washington who will attend Washington State University in pursuit of an undergraduate degree. Parent(s) of applicant must be involved in Washington's tree fruit industry. The scholarship is renewable for up to three additional years upon meeting terms of renewal. One award will be made yearly, either as a first year or renewal scholarship. One \$1000 scholarship.

Don Morse Memorial. Open to graduating seniors whose parents are growers or employees of Chelan Fruit. Preference will be given to students preparing for a career in the tree fruit industry. Renewable for one additional consecutive year upon meeting terms of renewal. Two \$1000 scholarships.

Doug Zahn Memorial. Established by the Washington Growers Clearing House in memory of tree fruit grower Doug Zahn, an active leader in the Washington state tree fruit industry and his community. To qualify, applicant must be an Okanogan County high school senior. The recipient must also plan on pursuing a two- or four- year agricultural related education or have parents that are either tree fruit growers or are employed within the tree fruit industry. One \$250 scholarship.

Douglas Fruit. Open to Pasco High School seniors whose parents are involved in the tree fruit industry. One \$1000 scholarship.

E. Ralph & Ida Strausz Memorial. Recognizing the long standing relationship between the Strausz family, the Cowiche community and the Cowiche Growers, Inc., the Strausz family is offering this scholarship to a graduation senior of Highland High School (Cowiche/Tieton, WA) in memory of E. Ralph & Ida Strausz. One \$500 scholarship.

Eckberg Family. Open to graduating seniors and former Manson High School graduates. Priority will be given to students who have been raised in a family employed in the tree fruit industry. Student must attend an accredited two- or four-year college or university. Scholarship is renewable for one additional year, upon meeting renewal terms.

Fruit Packers Supply. Open to college juniors and seniors from the Yakima Valley enrolled full-time in the agriculture department at Washington State University studying for a career in Washington's tree fruit industry. Student must be a full time student residing in (or near) Pullman and attending classes on campus. One \$1000 scholarship.

G.S. Long Co., Inc. Open to graduating high school seniors or current college students from Washington state enrolled in Yakima Valley Community College, Wenatchee Valley College, Washington State University, or University of Washington. Applicant must be pursuing a career in the tree fruit, grape or hop industries and have family/parents/guardians (or applicant themselves) who are somehow involved in Washington's tree fruit, hop or grape industries. One \$1000 scholarship.

Gary Gavin Memorial/Michelsen Packaging. Michelsen Packaging honors the memory of long time member Gary Gavin, a generous man who cared greatly about young people. The scholarship is open to graduating seniors from Chelan & Douglas counties pursuing a two- or four -year degree at an accredited college or university whose parents are growers of Washington tree fruit or are employed by a grower or packer in Washington's tree fruit industry.

H.M. & Marion Gilbert Memorial. Open to graduating seniors or current college/university students pursuing a degree an accredited two-or four-year college or university whose parents are growers or employees of Gilbert Orchards. One \$1000 scholarship.

Hansen Fruit Company LP. The scholarship is open to graduating high school seniors and students currently enrolled in an accredited two- or four-year college/university in Washington state. To qualify, applicant must be from the Yakima Valley and be studying in a tree fruit related field. The scholarship will be renewable for a second year for students meeting renewal qualifications. One \$1500 scholarship will be made yearly, either as a first or second year award.

Harold Grim Memorial. Open to graduation seniors and former graduates of Entiat High School (Entiat, WA) and surrounding school districts. One \$1000 scholarship.

Howard & Helen Hauff Memorial. Washington state high school seniors or current college students from Washington are eligible. Applicants should be studying for a degree in engineering or business and been raised in a family involved in a tree fruit industry. One \$500 scholarship.

Hunter Scholarship. Scholarship honors the pioneering spirit of early tree fruit industry families and receives its name from the Hunter apple label distributed by Welch Apples, Inc. of Wenatchee. It is open to graduating seniors of Eastmont High School pursuing a two- or four -year degree at an accredited college or university. One \$1000 scholarship.

Joe Bulleri Memorial. Open to current and former graduates of Quincy High School (Quincy, WA) pursuing a degree compatible with service to the tree fruit industry at an accredited two or four year college or university. Two \$2000 scholarships.

Joe Casper Memorial. Open to graduating seniors and former graduates of Highland High School (Coviche/Tieton,WA). One \$500 scholarship.

KJ Hendershott Memorial. Open to college juniors or seniors pursuing a career directly related to agri-business. One \$1000 scholarship.

Larson Fruit Company. Open to Selah High School (Selah, WA) seniors or graduating high school seniors whose parents are employed by Larson Fruit Company or a subsidiary of Larson Orchard Management Company. One \$1000 scholarship.

Lester Woda Memorial. This scholarship has been established by the friends, family and co-workers of Lester L. Woda. Mr. Woda followed his passion for agriculture and devoted his professional career to tree fruit production in Okanogan County. The scholarship is open to graduating seniors and currently enrolled college students from Okanogan County pursuing a degree in agriculture production. Award amount varies.

Louis Van Doren Memorial. Scholarship is open to Washington state students pursuing a degree in engineering at a Washington public or private four-year college or university. Scholarship will be awarded to a college sophomore, junior or senior and may be renewed upon satisfaction of requirements. One award will be made yearly, either as a new or renewing scholarship.

Matson Fruit. Scholarship offered to a graduating senior of Selah High School (Selah, WA). One \$1500 scholarship.

Monson Fruit. Open to graduating seniors of Selah High School (Selah, WA) pursuing an agriculture-related or business-related degree. One \$1000 scholarship.

Moss Adams LLP.-E. Peter Krier Scholarship. This scholarship, established by Moss Adams LLP, is in honor of retired partner E. Peter Krier. During Pete's tenure at Moss Adams he served the agri-business community of the Yakima valley with his uncanny tax knowledge and creativity. This scholarship is open to college juniors, seniors, or fifth year students from the Yakima valley, enrolled in a university in Washington state, pursuing a degree in accounting. One \$500 scholarship.

Northwest Farm Credit Services "1" Applicants must be Washington state high school seniors or current college students from Washington state. Parents/Guardians of the applicants must be employed in an entry level laborer or entry level management position by a commercial grower or packer in Washington's tree fruit industries. Three \$1000 scholarships.

Northwest Farm Credit Services "2" Applicants must be Washington state high school seniors or current college students from Washington state. Parents/Guardians or the applicants themselves must be employed in an entry level laborer or entry level management position by a commercial grower or packer in Washington's tree fruit industries. Applicant must be pursuing a career in agriculture finance or business administration with an emphasis in the agriculture industry. One \$2000 scholarship.

Olympic Fruit. Open to graduating seniors or current college/university students pursuing a degree an accredited two- or four-year college or university who are employed by or whose parents are employed by or are growers of Olympic Fruit. One \$1000 scholarship.

Orville & Bertha Peebles Memorial. This yearly scholarship is awarded in honor of Orville & Bertha Peebles, long time residents of the Lake Chelan Valley and growers of Washington apples. It is open to current and former graduates of Chelan and Manson high schools raised in families connected to the tree fruit industry. One \$1000 scholarship.

George Personette/Clarence Zimmerman Memorial. Open to graduating seniors of Highland High School. One \$500 scholarship.

Phil Jenkins Memorial/POM club. Open to students currently enrolled or entering a college/university who plan to live and work in the tree fruit industry in the Yakima valley following the completion of their degree. Scholarship is awarded on behalf of the Yakima Pomological Club. Amount varies.

Pottratz Family. Open to current and former graduates of Highland High School attending a two- or four-year community college/university or technical school. Two \$1000 scholarships.

Robert and Hope Allan Memorial. Open to graduating seniors of Naches High School (Naches, WA) pursuing a degree at an accredited two or four year college or trade school. Preference will be given to students preparing for a career in agriculture. While high school grade point average will be considered, it is not the most important consideration. Scholarship numbers and amounts vary.

Roy Farms. Open to East Valley High School (Moxee, WA) seniors who are pursuing a degree in the field of agriculture (or related fields) OR who are children of a parent(s) currently employed by Roy Farms, Inc. One \$1000 scholarship.

Sagemoor Farms. Open to graduating students and students currently enrolled in a two- or four-year college/ university program whose parents are employed at Sagemoor Farms (Pasco, WA). To apply, parents should obtain application and criteria at the main office of Sagemoor. Amount varies.

Snokist Growers. Open to graduating seniors whose parents/guardians, or applicants themselves, are employees of Snokist Growers. Two \$1000 scholarships.

Stadelman Fruit/Lower Yakima Valley: Open to graduating seniors from the lower Yakima Valley whose parents are growers or employees of Stadelman Fruit LLC. Students must plan to attend an accredited two- or four-year community college, university or technical school. Scholarship is renewable for one additional year, upon meeting terms of renewal. Two \$1000 awards.

Stadelman Fruit/Milton-Freewater (OR): Open to graduating seniors whose parents are employees or growers of Stadelman Fruit LLC located in Milton-Freewater. Students must plan to attend an accredited two- or four-year community college, university or technical school. Scholarship is renewable for one additional year, upon meeting terms of renewal. One \$500 scholarship.

Stadelman Fruit/Hood River (OR): Open to graduating seniors whose parents are employees or growers of Stadelman Fruit LLC located in Hood River. Students must plan to attend an accredited two- or four-year community college, university or technical school. Scholarship is renewable for one additional year, upon meeting terms of renewal. Two \$1000 scholarships.

Stemilt Growers, Inc. The Stemilt Growers, Inc. scholarship is open to college students entering their junior or senior years and pursuing a career in accounting. In addition to the scholarship award, students will participate in a two-month internship in the accounting department at Stemilt's Wenatchee headquarters. Applicants must have ties to Central Washington. The award may be renewed for up to one additional year, upon meeting renewal requirements. One \$2500 scholarship.

Sundquist Fruit & Cold Storage. Open to current college students raised in Yakima County pursuing a career in production agriculture. One \$1000 scholarship.

Tree Top, Inc. Open to graduating high school seniors whose parents are either: (1) contracted grower-members of Tree Top, Inc., or, (2) employees of Tree Top, Inc. Applicants must plan to attend an accredited two- or four-year college or university. The awards are based upon merit and academics. Family financial information is not a requirement of the application process. The scholarships are not limited to residents of Washington state. Two \$1250 scholarships.

Valent USA. Open to students enrolled in the tree fruit programs at Yakima Valley Community College, Wenatchee Valley College, or Washington State University. Two \$1000 awards.

Valley Fruit Company. Scholarship is open to: graduating seniors who are the children and grandchildren of employees of Valley Fruit Orchards; graduating seniors who are the children and grandchildren of growers and employees of Valley Fruit III; and graduating Wapato High School seniors. Eligible applicants must pursue an education at Yakima Valley Community College or Big Bend Community College (Moses Lake). This scholarship covers the cost of tuition at the named colleges and is renewable for a second year.

Van Doren Sales. Open to graduating seniors and former graduates of Eastmont, Wenatchee, Cascade, Cashmere, Chelan, or Waterville high schools pursuing a vocational education at a two year community college or vocational trade school in Washington state. One \$1500 scholarship, with second year renewal upon qualification.

Washington Apple Education Foundation. Washington state high school seniors or current college students from Washington are eligible. Applicants should be involved in Washington's tree fruit industry, either pursuing a career in the industry or having been raised in a family involved in the industry. Applicants cannot be related to current WAEF directors or WAEF staff members. Scholarship amounts and numbers vary.

Washington Fruit & Produce. Open to graduating seniors and students currently enrolled in a two- or four-year Washington state college/university whose parent(s) are employed at Washington Fruit & Produce Company. Scholarship number and amounts vary.

Wenatchee Traffic Club. Open to Washington state high school seniors or current college students from Washington state pursuing a career in the tree fruit industry and whose parents/guardians (or applicants themselves) are somehow involved/employed in Washington's tree fruit industry. Applicants must be residents of Chelan, Douglas, Grant or Okanogan counties. Preference will be given to students who plan to attend, or are attending, Wenatchee Valley College. Scholarship amounts vary.

Wilbur Ellis. Applicants must be Washington state high school seniors or current college students from Washington state. Parents/Guardians of the applicants or applicants themselves must be employed in an entry level laborer or entry level management position by a commercial grower or packer in Washington's tree fruit, grape or hop industries. Ten \$1000 scholarships.

Yakama Juice. Open to college-bound and college-enrolled students whose parents are employees of Yakama Juice. Scholarships may be used at an accredited trade school or two- or four-year community college or university. Up to five \$1000 scholarships.

Yakima Valley Growers-Shippers Assn. Open to graduating seniors and current Washington state college students who are employed by or are children of general members of the Yakima Valley Growers-Shippers Association (YVGSA) or the children of employees or growers of a general member of the YVGSA. Applicants should be pursuing a degree compatible with service to the tree fruit industry (horticulture, business, refrigeration, etc.). Two \$750 awards.

All scholarship deadlines are March 1, 2009. Use the universal scholarship application form for all scholarships managed by the Washington Apple Education Foundation (unless otherwise noted).
